| The prophet Ezekiel spoke to the people of Israel from 593-571 BC just prior to and while they were in exile in Babylon. It was a time when the national sin of God's people had reached an all-time high, leading to an all-time spiritual low. It was a time of deep grief and mourning, fear and doubt. |
| God called upon Ezekiel to pronounce judgment on the Israelites. |
| Ezekiel 7.5,7: Disaster! Unheard of disaster! See, it comes! The time has come! The day is near! There is panic, not joy, on the mountains |
| In the ancient world, bones symbolized the The valley of dry bones was a picture of how the people of God felt: scattered, lifeless, dried out, washed out, with no hope of revival. The first step to new life is coming to grips with life as it is. |
| Ezekiel 37.3a: Son of man, can these bones live? Ezekiel 37.3b: Sovereign Lord, only you alone know. |
| The first step in bringing new life back into the valley of bones is to stand still amidst the wasteland, listen to the pain in the valley, and bear witness to the grief in our own life and in the lives of others. |
| God could have spoken life into those dry bones all on his own; but God instead commanded Ezekiel to prophesy. |
| And Ezekiel's became the means through which God worked to bring life to that valley of bones. |
| Ezekiel 37.11,14: These bones are the people They say, "Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone." But Ezekiel, I want you to tell the people, "I will put my Spirit in you, and you will live." |
